Code of Conduct for Parents/Spectators

1. Never pressure a child to play football; they need to enjoy playing.
2. Praise effort and performance more than results.
3. Praise good behaviour quickly to show that adults value it.
4. Help them understand the rules and encourage your child to play by them.
5. Applaud good play by either team.
6. Do not argue with the coach/referee, or question his/her decision – REMEMBER he/she is a volunteer and giving up his/her time for your child.
7. STAY OFF THE PITCH – do not interfere; let the referee deal with any situations on the field of play.
8. Do not coach from the sidelines or shout at a child if they make a mistake.
9. Do not use offensive, insulting, abusive or racist language/behaviour towards players, officials, coaches, spectators or in front of or around children.
10. Do not criticise/victimise any player regarding their football abilities.
11. Racist behaviour towards players, officials or spectators has no place in our game and positive action will be taken against offenders.
12. Enjoy watching the game whether your team win or lose.
13. It is the parents/guardians responsibility that they collect their child after training/matches **on time**.
14. No vehicles are to be parked on the grass at Hills Lane
15. Please ensure that you do not leave litter on the field – dispose of it properly.

Code of Conduct for Players

1. Shin pads/guards to be worn at all times at training and in matches.
2. Chewing gum is not allowed. No jewellery to be worn at training or matches.
3. Play because you enjoy football, not to please someone else.
4. Learn the rules and play by them.
5. Accept the referee's decision – do not argue.
6. Do not attempt to mislead the referee by faking an injury – get on with the game.
7. Do not use offensive, insulting, abusive or racist language/behaviour towards players, officials, coaches, spectators or in front of or around children.
8. Do not criticise/victimise any player regarding their football abilities.
9. Racist behaviour towards players, officials, coaches or spectators has no place in our game and positive action will be taken against offenders.
10. Control your mouth and your temper.
11. Do not over-react when your team scores a goal.
12. Respect your opponents and shake hands with them at the end of the game – win or lose.
13. Please ensure that you do not leave litter on the field – dispose of it properly.

Code of Conduct for Managers/Coaches/Officials

1. Emphasise fun and enjoyment.
2. Ensure your players know the rules and encourage them to play by them.
3. Set good examples by being polite and friendly to the opposition.
4. Praise children for effort, performance, good behaviour and for controlling their temper.
5. Support all efforts to remove verbal and physical abuse from children's sporting activity.
6. Do not use offensive, insulting, abusive or racist language/behaviour towards players, officials, coaches, spectators or in front of or around children.
7. Do not criticise/victimise any player regarding their football abilities.
8. Respect the official's decisions. Remember he/she is a volunteer and is giving up his/her time.
9. Racist behaviour towards players, officials or spectators has no place in our game and positive action will be taken against offenders.
10. Encourage your team to shake hands at the end of the game whether your team win or lose.
11. Please ensure that you do not leave litter on the field – dispose of it properly.
12. No vehicles are to be parked on the grass at Hills Lane.
13. Individuals must not be under the influence of alcohol or illegal substances whilst carrying out duties on behalf of The Club, in any situation where children are present.
